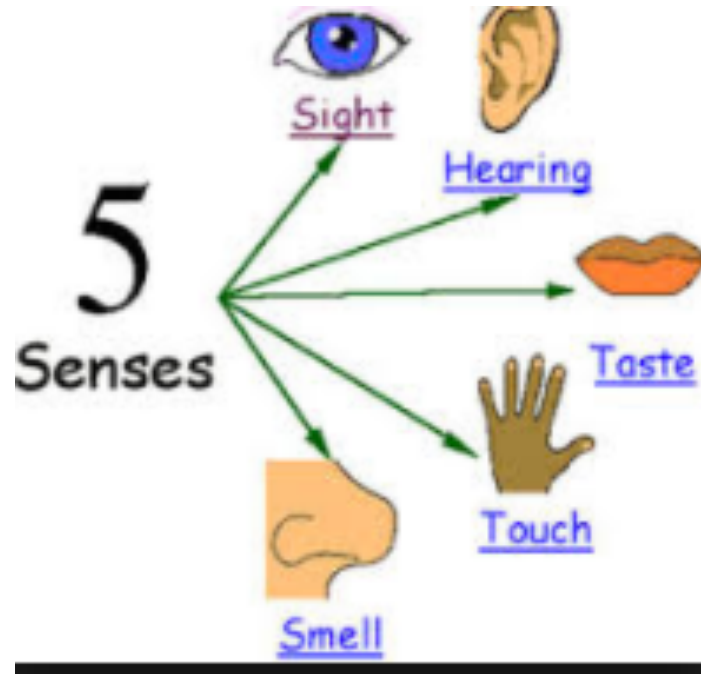


Your Character Writing
